Conference Details

The conference has been designed to meet the educational needs of medical equipment service and support professionals in our region. It is our intent to provide information that is of value to attendees through a variety of practical and informative sessions throughout the day. Please see the attached conference schedule and descriptions of the individual sessions to select the items that are of the greatest interest to you. Sessions

Keynote Presentation – How to Win Friends and Influence Administration, presented by Mr. John Krieg, founder and President of MD Publishing. No matter what profession, skill or education level, the keys to success rely on relationships and interpersonal skills. Using techniques from the best-selling Andrew Carnegie book, this presentation will help anyone build relationships and motivate others.

ZOLL BiPhasic Defibrillator Service – This four hour session will present a technical overview of the unit, providing basic information necessary for service and troubleshooting. (Presented by representatives from Zoll)

Integration of Vital Signs into the Electronic Medical Record (EMR) – The presentation will help describe the process and clinical value of importing information from the bedside monitor into the patient file in a medical record system. (Presented by representatives from Philips Medical)

CBET Certification Review – This two hour session will cover topics relevant to the questions on a certification exam, with the opportunity to review sample questions. (Presented by Glen Wolfe)

Benchmarking – One way to demonstrate the value of the medical equipment service professional is to utilize standard metrics that will enable internal and external comparisons to demonstrate best practices. (Presented by Steve Campbell from AAMI/TMC)

Career Development – Learn what employers are looking for when they need to fill open positions for medical equipment service and support. (Presented by Doug Stephens from Stephens International Recruiting)

Steam System Quality and Troubleshooting – This session will present information to aid in the analysis of common issues related to steam systems and steam sterilization. (Presented by Walt Deacon of Thermo Diagnostics)

Network Security Basics – With the blurred lines between medical equipment and computer systems, it is more important than ever to have an understanding of the basic purpose and process for managing network security. (Presented by representatives from Community Health Network Information Services)

AAMI's Technology Management Council (TMC) Activities – Learn more about the TMC and what they are doing to support the medical equipment service professionals. (Presented by Steve Campbell from AAMI/TMC)

Facility Planning From the Hospital's Perspective – The process of building a new hospital is complex. Listen to some of the lessons learned and strategies used in preparation for the new facility that was recently approved. (Presented by representatives from Wishard Health Services)

Incident Investigations and Depositions – Participants in this session will learn how to better prepare for a situation where medical equipment may have caused, or contributed to, a patient injury. (Presented by representatives from Community Health Network Risk Management)

Panel Discussion: The Value of Credentials – Listen to, and participate in, a discussion of whether our profession should have some standard type of required credentials for our service professionals.

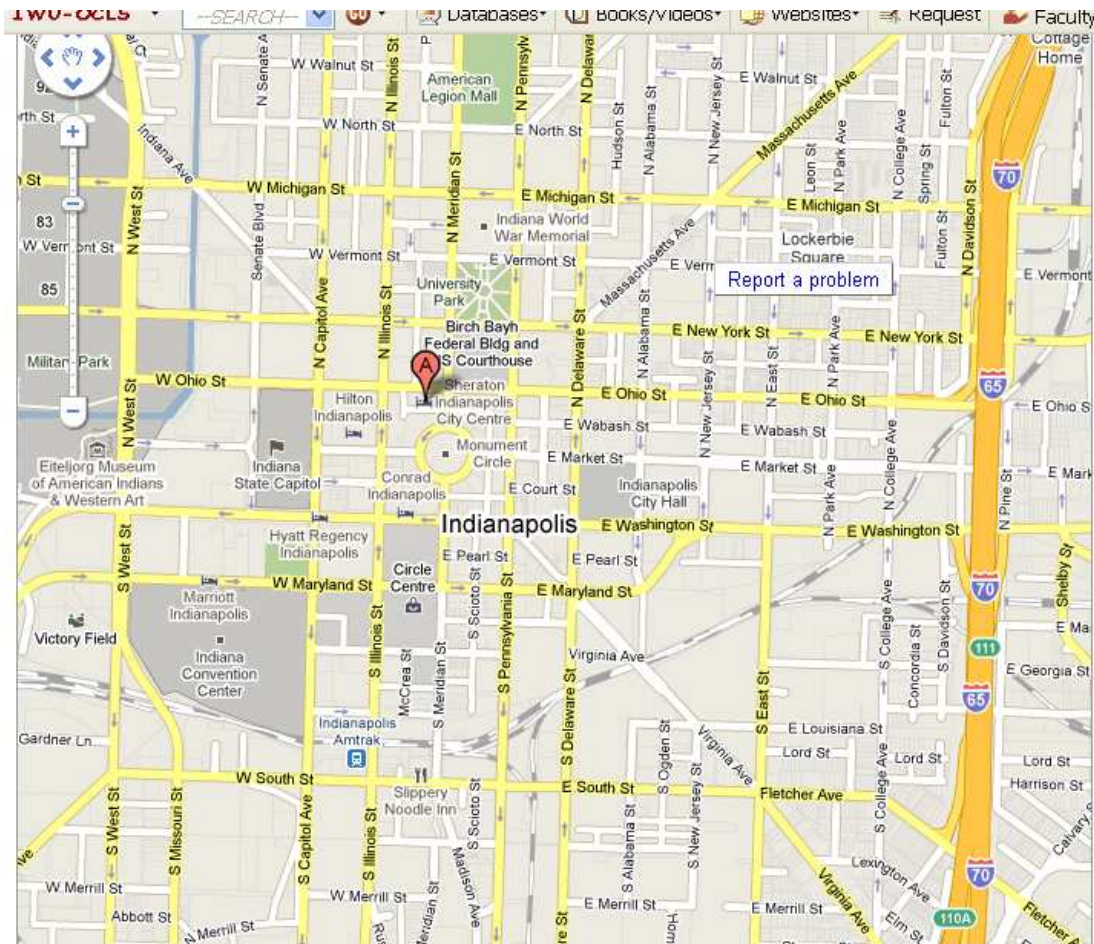

From the Airport: Follow I-70 East to Exit 79B, which is Illinois Street. Go North on Illinois street 1.4 miles to Ohio Street. Turn right on Ohio Street, and the Sheraton is immediately on the right.



From I-65 South, take I-70 West to Exit 79B, Illinois Street (see above).

From I-69, follow I-465 S to I-70 West (see above).

From I-65 North, take exit 113 toward Meridian Street, merge on to west 11th Street, then turn right on Meridian. Go south to West Ohio Street, turn right, the Sheraton is on the left.
